**IMMIGRATION (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 2009**

The Governor in Cabinet in exercise of the powers conferred by section 99 of the Immigration Law (2007 Revision), makes the following Regulations-

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Immigration (Amendment) Regulations, 2009. Citation

2. The Immigration Regulations (2007 Revision) are amended by repealing item 8 of the Second Schedule – Points System – under the heading "Possessing Close Caymanian Connections", and substituting the following- Amendment of the  
Second Schedule to the  
Immigration Regulations  
(2007 Revision) – points  
system

<b><u>"8. Possessing Close Caymanian Connections"</u></b>	(Maximum 100)
Applicant's relationship to person who is Caymanian	
(a) an applicant who is a Cuban national and who by virtue of a close Caymanian family connection was granted permission to reside in the Cayman Islands by the Governor in Executive Council (as it then was), and who applies for permanent residence prior to 17 <sup>th</sup> March, 2010	60 points
(b) an applicant who is the parent, child or spouse of a Caymanian	40 points
(c) an applicant who is the brother, sister or grandparent of a Caymanian	20 points
<b><u>Explanation</u></b>  1. An applicant is allocated the most points (100 points) if- <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(a) he is the parent, child or spouse of a Caymanian;</li> <li>(b) he is a Cuban national granted permission to reside in the Cayman Islands by the Governor in Executive Council; and</li> <li>(c) he applies for permanent residence prior to 17<sup>th</sup> March, 2010.</li> </ul>	

2. An applicant is allocated 80 points if-
  - (a) he is the brother, sister or grandparent of a Caymanian;
  - (b) he is a Cuban national granted permission to reside in the Cayman Islands by the Governor in Executive Council; and
  - (c) he applies for permanent residence prior to 17<sup>th</sup> March, 2010.
3. An applicant who is the parent, child or spouse of a Caymanian but who is not a Cuban national granted permission to reside in the Cayman Islands by the Governor in Executive Council is allocated 40 points.
4. An applicant who is the brother, sister or grandparent of a Caymanian but who is not a Cuban national granted permission to reside in the Cayman Islands by the Governor in Executive Council is allocated 20 points.”.
