**A LAW TO FURTHER APPROPRIATE EXECUTIVE FINANCIAL  
TRANSACTIONS FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR ENDING 30 JUNE 2006**

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

1. This Law may be cited as the Supplementary Appropriation (July 2005 to June 2006) (No. 2) Law, 2006. Short title
2. The Governor in Cabinet may incur executive expenses, acquire executive assets, make equity investments or loans and undertake borrowing for the financial year ending 30 June 2006 in the amount and for the respective purposes set forth in the Schedule. Appropriation authority
