**A LAW TO AMEND THE CUSTOMS LAW (2003 REVISION) TO  
ENABLE STAFF FOR THE CUSTOMS DEPARTMENT TO BE  
APPOINTED BY THE CHIEF OFFICER IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE  
PUBLIC SERVICE MANAGEMENT LAW ; AND FOR INCIDENTAL  
AND CONNECTED PURPOSES**

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

1. (1) This Law may be cited as the Customs (Amendment) Law, 2005. Short title and commencement
- (2) This Law shall come into force concurrently with the Public Service Management Law, 2005. Law No. 27 of 2005
2. Section 2 of the of the Customs Law (2003 Revision), hereinafter called the principal Law, is amended by the insertion in the appropriate place of the following – Amendment of section 2 - Definitions
  - ‘ “chief officer” means the chief officer having oversight of the Customs Department, referred to in section 3 of the Public Management and Finance Law (2003 Revision);’.

3. Section 4 of the principal Law is amended by the repeal of the word “Governor” and substituting in its place the words “chief officer, in accordance with the Public Service Management Law, 2005, but after consultation with the Official Member responsible for the portfolio of which the Customs Department may be part.”.

Amendment of section 6  
- Officers

4. The principal Law is amended in section 6 (1) by repealing the word “Governor” and substituting therefor the words “chief officer, in accordance with the Public Service Management Law, 2005.”.
