A LAW TO AMEND THE SUMMARY JURISDICTION LAW (1995 REVISION) TO ENABLE SUPPORT STAFF FOR THE SUMMARY COURT TO BE APPOINTED BY THE CHIEF OFFICER IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PUBLIC SERVICE MANAGEMENT LAW; AND FOR INCIDENTAL AND CONNECTED PURPOSES

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

1. (1) This Law may be cited as the Summary Jurisdiction (Amendment) Law, 2005. Short title and commencement
- (2) This Law shall come into operation concurrently with the coming into force of the Public Service Management Law, 2005. Law No. 27 of 2005
2. The Summary Jurisdiction Law (2004 Revision), hereinafter called the principal Law, is amended in section 2 by the insertion in the appropriate alphabetical place of the following - Amendment of section 2
- Definitions

‘ “chief officer” means the chief officer of the judicial administration appointed in accordance with section 3 of the Public Management and Finance Law (2003 Revision);’.

3. The principal Law is amended in section 10 -

(a) in subsection (2),

(i) in the first sentence, by repealing the words “The Governor in accordance with the Public Service Commission Law (Revised)” and the substituting therefor the words “The chief officer, in accordance with the Public Service Management Law, 2005,”;

(ii) in the second sentence, by repealing the word “Governor” and substituting therefor the word “chief officer”;

(b) in subsection (3) by repealing the word “Governor” and substituting therefor the word “chief officer”.
