REVISION) FOR THE PURPOSE OF MAKING PROVISION FOR THE

FOR INCIDENTAL AND CONNECTED MATTERS**

THE TRAFFIC (AMENDMENT) BILL, 2010

MEMORANDUM OF OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill amends the Traffic Law (2003 Revision).

Clause 1 provides the short title.

Clause 2 repeals and substitutes the definition of the term “oversize truck” by changing some figures while retaining the number and sequence of paragraphs in the principal Law. Effectively, paragraph (a) deletes “eight feet” and replaces it with “eight feet six inches”. Paragraph (b) remains unchanged at fourteen feet. Paragraph (c) deletes “sixty thousand pounds” and replaces it with “sixty-six thousand pounds”, while paragraph (d) deletes “forty feet” and inserts “forty-five feet”.

“ “oversize vehicle” means a vehicle in any of the following categories -

- (a) having an overall width in excess of eight feet and six inches;
- (b) having an overall travelling height in excess of fourteen feet;
- (c) having a maximum gross weight in excess of sixty-six thousand pounds; and
- (d) towing a trailer the length of which exceeds forty-five feet;”.
