**A LAW TO AMEND THE CUSTOMS LAW (2007 REVISION) AS A
CONSEQUENCE OF THE CREATION OF THE CONSTITUTIONAL
OFFICE OF MINISTER CHARGED WITH RESPONSIBILITY FOR
FINANCE; AND TO MAKE PROVISION FOR INCIDENTAL AND
CONNECTED MATTERS**

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

1. (1) This Law may be cited as the Customs (Amendment) (No. 2) Law, 2009.

Short title and
commencement

(2) This Law shall come into force immediately after the coming into force of the Cayman Islands Constitution Order 2009.

2. The Customs Law (2007 Revision) is amended in section 74(2)(a) by deleting the words “Financial Secretary” and substituting the words “Minister charged with responsibility for finance under section 54 of Schedule 2 to the Cayman Islands Constitution Order 2009”.

Amendment of section
74 of the Customs Law
(2007 Revision) - bonds
and security

3. (1) Every matter commenced under the former Law and partly dealt with by the Financial Secretary when the new Law comes into force, is to be continued and dealt with in all respects as if the new Law had not come into force.

Transitional provisions

(2) Every matter commenced under the former Law and not wholly or partly dealt with by the Financial Secretary when the new Law comes into force, is to be taken to be a matter commenced under the new Law and the provisions of the new Law are to apply accordingly.

(3) In this section -

“former Law” means the principal Law in force immediately before the date of commencement of this Law; and

“new Law” means the principal Law as amended by this Law.
