THE POLICE (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 2010

The Governor in Cabinet, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 87 of the Police Law (2006 Revision) and section 43(1) and (3) of the Public Service Management Law (2007 Revision), makes the following Regulations -

1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the Police (Amendment) Regulations, 2010. Citation and expiry

(2) These Regulations shall cease to have effect on 30 June, 2011 in relation to any existing employment agreement and, on 1 July, 2011, the Police Regulations that were in force immediately prior to the date of commencement of these Regulations shall, so far as they are amended by these Regulations, again operate in relation to any existing employment agreement, as though these Regulations had not been made and the said amendments had not been in operation.

(3) In this regulation -

“employment agreement” has the same meaning as in the Public Service Management Law (2007 Revision); and (2007 Revision)

“existing employment agreement” means an employment agreement which, immediately prior to the date of commencement of these Regulations, has full force, effect and validity.

2. The Police Regulations (1996 Revision) are amended by repealing regulation 12 and substituting the following regulation -

12. Officers are entitled to leave passages in accordance with the Personnel Regulations, 2006.”.

3. The Police Regulations (1996 Revision) are amended in the Schedule by deleting item 3 and the particulars relating thereto.
