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Foreword

This financial report presents the unaudited financial information, along with an analysis and commentary, for the first quarter, of the 2019 Financial Year, ended 31 March 2019 (the period) for Core Government.

Amounts herein are stated in Cayman Islands Dollars. The results of Core Government along with, Statutory Authorities and Government Owned Companies (SAGCs or Public Entities) are shown in the Statement of Financial Performance and, collectively, these separate entities are referred to in this report as the Entire Public Sector (EPS)

The information contained herein is based on records obtained from the General Ledger of the Government's financial management system. It is also based on the representations and judgments provided by the Chief Financial Officers of Ministries, Portfolios, Offices, and Statutory Authorities and Government Owned Companies.

As required by Section 29 (1) of the Public Management and Finance Law (2018 Revision) (the "PMFL"), the unaudited quarterly financial report will be published by notice in the Gazette, within six weeks after the end of each of the first three quarters in each Financial Year. The Ministry aims to Gazette the remaining Second Quarter (1 April to 30 June 2019) and Third Quarter (1 July to 30 September 2019) Reports by 9 August 2019 and 8 November 2019, respectively.

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Executive Summary

The financial results of the Core Government for the quarter ended 31 March 2019 show a \$215.4 million surplus (\$216.80 million for the Entire Public Sector (EPS)) and bank account balances of \$747.1 million in cash and deposits.

When combined with the performance of SAGCs, the overall surplus was \$44.4 million higher than the \$172.4 million EPS surplus the 2019 budget anticipated for the period. This was primarily due to higher coercive revenues (a positive variance of \$25.5 million – as per page 10) and higher investment revenues (a positive variance of \$3.7 million – as per page 10) complemented by lower levels of expenditures in Personnel Costs (a variance of \$3.5 million – as per page 10), Supplies and Consumables (a variance of \$8.8 million – as per page 10) and Transfer Payments (a variance of \$2.8 million – as per page 10) within Core Government.

The Government experienced favourable variances to budget in all revenue lines, albeit not to the extent accomplished in coercive revenues. Other Revenue and Investment Revenue exceeded the budget by \$1.1 million and \$3.7 million, respectively (as per page 10). Additionally, favourable variances in Personnel Costs and Supplies and Consumables, were accompanied by lower than budgeted expenditures in Transfer Payments and higher than anticipated net Gains on Financial and Non-financial Instruments (a variance of \$0.5 million – as per page 10).

Compared to the same period in the prior year, Total Revenues of Core Government have increased \$28.0 million. Additionally, Total Expenses of Core Government have risen by \$9.3 million. SAGCs contribution, compared to first quarter of the prior year, has decreased by \$0.9 million. Overall Net Surplus for the EPS has improved \$17.8 million when compared to the first quarter's result in the prior year.

Adherence to fiscal policy continues to yield significant improvements in the overall cash and deposits balance held by Core Government. Operating Cash and Deposits were \$580.1 million and Reserves and Restricted Deposits were \$167.0 million, for a total Cash and Deposits balance of \$747.1 million.

It should also be noted that early savings in Expenses may not translate into full year savings and may be due to timing differences. Vacant posts and delayed projects will impact current costs reflected in Personnel Costs and Supplies and Consumables, respectively.

A summary of the financial results are presented in Table 1 – Executive Summary, on page 6.



Cash


Cash and Cash Equivalents (including fixed deposits with maturity durations not exceeding 90 days) were \$84.8 million and Marketable Securities (comprised solely of fixed deposits with maturity durations exceeding 90 days but not exceeding one (1) year) were \$662.3 million, for a total of \$747.1 million with respect to bank account balances. Total Cash and Deposits (held for longer than 90 days but less than a year) balances are significantly higher (approx. \$227.0 million) than anticipated in the 2019 Plan & Estimates document. Due to the significant cash balances on-hand, the Government now places funds on longer-term fixed deposits. These longer-term deposits are reflected as Marketable Securities (on the Statement of Financial Position) and are not included in the definition of 'Cash and Cash Equivalents', which only represent deposits that do not exceed 90 days to maturity. A substantial portion of Government's Operating Cash is likely to be used for repaying the bond obligation referenced below.




Borrowings

Core Government's most significant recorded liability was the Debt Balance which stood at \$417.4 million as at 31 March 2019 (\$287.0 million of which is due within one year); this is \$31.2 million lower than the debt balance at 31 March 2018. Additionally, the Unfunded Pension Liability was \$411.1 million (with respect to the Defined Benefit portion of Public Sector pension plans). The Debt Balance continues to decline with scheduled principal repayments being made. The Government will repay its outstanding US \$312 million bond obligation in November 2019.

Revenues

Coercive Revenue



Coercive Revenue recorded for the period was \$25.5 million above budgeted expectations and \$25.3 million higher than prior year-to-date actual results. The positive variance to budget, (the amount of each variance is shown in brackets in the details that follow), was mainly concentrated in Levies on Property (Stamp Duty – Land Transfers, \$5.9 million); Import Duties (Other Import Duty, \$4.4 million, Alcoholic Beverages Duty, \$1.0 million and Gasoline and Diesel Duty, \$1.1 million); and Domestic Levies on Goods and Services (Bank and Trust Licences, \$4.9 million, Mutual Fund Administrators, \$1.4 million, Partnership Fees, \$2.4 million, and Tourist Accommodation Charges, \$2.9 million). These aforementioned positive variances from the 2019 Budget are offset by negative variances in Security Investment Business Licences (\$1.5 million) and Provision for Continuation of Work Permits – Grants (\$1.6 million).

Stamp Duty on Land Transfers was higher due to higher volumes of property transactions coupled with increasing property values; this trend is a continuation of the 2018 real estate boom; however, revenues generated were below results for prior year-to-date. Banks and Trust Licences Fees were higher than anticipated due to fewer terminations than expected and fees being charged on higher asset values held by the licencees; when compared to prior year-to-date results there is a marginal decrease. Mutual Fund Administrators fees were higher due to the increase in the number of funds processed when compared to expectations; when compared to prior year-to-date this revenue stream has also declined. Partnership Fees were higher due to under-estimation in the growth of registrations which surpassed the anticipated growth factors used at the time of budget; unlike the previously mentioned revenue lines, current results are significantly ahead of prior year-to-date performance. Additionally, Tourist Accommodation Charges were favourable mainly due to continued record high visitor arrivals (approximately a 8.67% increase, in air arrivals over last year, however, there has been a decline in cruise arrivals by 4.6%, compared to prior year-to-date) as a result of persistent strategic marketing, coupled with the residual effects of the eastern Caribbean being hit by devastating hurricanes in the recent past; when compared to prior year-to-date there is also an increase in Tourist Accommodation Charges.

Despite overall favourable results in revenues, when compared to the 2019 Budget, there were areas that fell short of projected expectations; in particular, Security Investment Business Licences (\$1.5 million negative variance) and Provision for Continuation of Work Permit – Grants (\$1.6 million negative variance). The Cayman Islands Monetary Authority (CIMA) has indicated that Security Investment Business Licences budgeted registrations were too high for both 2018 and 2019. Compared to actual results from the same period in the prior year, there's a \$0.3 million favourable variance. Also, at the time of the forecast for 2018 and 2019 Budgets it was believed that the backlog of Permanent Residence (PR) applications would still persist due to the uncertainty surrounding the revamp of the PR Point system, and has resulted in the annual forecast being significantly overstated. Compared to actual results from the same period in the prior year, there's only a \$0.2 million unfavourable variance.

As shown by page 18, the first quarter generated coercive revenues of \$358.1 million and was 8% (\$25.3 million) higher than the first quarter 2018 (\$332.8 million). The majority of this change related to 6% higher Domestic Levies on Goods and Services (\$17.2 million) and 25% higher Import Duties (\$10.3 million). Compared to the first quarter of 2018 Levies on Property have declined by 12% (\$2.2 million).



Sales of Goods & Services

Sales of Goods & Services recorded for the period was \$0.3 million ahead of projections but behind prior year-to-date results by \$0.6 million. Despite Fees and Charges being above budget by \$0.5 million, they were behind prior year's actual performance for the quarter by \$0.7 million.

Investment Revenue

Investment Revenue has produced \$4.7 million, which was \$3.7 million above the year-to-date budget of \$1.0 million and is \$2.1 million above the prior year-to-date results. Additionally, the results of the first quarter have already generated \$0.7 million more than the full year budgeted revenue. High cash balances have afforded higher values to be placed on deposit and when coupled with increases in the US prime rates have driven higher yields on investments (all held in the form of fixed deposits).

Expenses

Personnel Costs


Costs relating to personnel for the first three months of 2019 amounted to \$76.7million, resulting in a savings in Personnel Costs of \$3.5 million compared to a budget of \$80.2 million. This favourable variance is the result of several Ministries, Portfolios and Offices having vacant posts. Costs were higher than prior year-to-date due to a 5% Cost of Living adjustment (COLA) awarded at the end of the third quarter 2018.

Supplies and Consumables

Expenses for supplies and consumables of \$19.9 million were recorded for the first three months of 2019, producing a savings of \$8.8 million compared to budgeted costs of \$28.7 million. When compared to prior year-to-date cost there is virtually no variance.

The most significant savings continue to be related to the Purchase of Services which accounts for 67% of the overall variance. Ministries, Portfolios and Offices anticipate that as the year progresses costs will align closer to budgeted projections.



Outputs from Non-Governmental Output Suppliers

Outputs from Non-Government Output Suppliers of \$9.6 million were \$3.6 million above the year-to-date budget and \$3.3 million higher than prior year, due to expenditure on NGS 55 – Tertiary Care at

Local and Overseas Institutions of \$6.2 million. The costs for NGS 55 are currently \$3.8 million higher than budgeted and \$3.2 million higher than prior year-to-date spending.

Transfer Payments

Transfer Payments of \$7.0 million were \$2.8 million less than budgeted for the period and \$2.3 million lower than prior year-to-date; this is due to significant underspending in Scholarships and Bursaries of \$2.5 million below year-to-date budget. The reduced expenditure is due to scholarship recipients failing to meet and/or failing to maintain, the requirements to obtain funding during the period coupled with the timing of spring/fall drawdowns not yet being awarded.

Performance of Statutory Authorities and Government Owned Companies

Public Entities recorded a combined net Operating Surplus of \$1.3 million; this was \$2.8 million more favourable than budgeted for the period. Based on the most recent information received from SAGCs (not all SAGCs provided updates as at 31 March 2019), this favourable variance is mainly attributed to results being better than expected at: the Cayman Islands Monetary Authority and the Port Authority of the Cayman Islands. These favourable variances were partially offset by the unfavourable performance of Cayman Airways Limited.

SAGCs contribution to the Net Surplus compared to prior year-to-date is \$0.9 million lower.

Net cash inflows from Operating Activities totalled \$215.7 million for the period.

Investing Activities

(See page 15)

Investing Activities relating to fixed deposit maturities yielded \$249.3 million.

Additionally, \$507.4 million was used for Investing Activities, of which \$487.4 million relates to placements of fixed deposits. The effect of the movement (i.e. \$249.3 million less \$487.4 million) is an increase in the net amount placed on fixed deposits of \$238.1 million. Additionally, \$20.0 million was utilised for Capital Investment and Expenditures relating to purchases of Property, Plant & Equipment (\$13.0 million) and Equity Investments in Public Entities (\$7.0 million).

Financing Activities

Debt principal repayments were \$2.6 million for the period.

Conclusion

The overall fiscal performance reported for the period shows an EPS Net Surplus of \$216.8 million, which is 26% (\$44.4 million) higher than budgeted. This favourable position was due to revenues and expenses favourably outperforming initial projections by 9% (\$30.8 million) and 6% (\$10.8 million), respectively. Additionally, Statutory Authorities and Government Owned Companies contributed a further \$1.3 million to the overall surplus for the Entire Public Sector; the SAGCs performances exceeded the estimated results for the first quarter, by \$2.8 million.

Compared to Q1 2018, Core Government Revenues was 8% (\$28.0 million) higher; Expenses were also higher 6% (\$9.3 million). SAGCs performances were 40% (\$0.9 million) lower. Overall EPS Net Surplus was 9% (\$17.8 million) higher.

As customary, due to the cyclical nature of revenues, the first quarter's Coercive revenue results of \$358.1 million are expected to be the highest revenues earned in any single quarter for 2019. This is directly related to Financial Services fees being due at the beginning of each year.

Government's Cash position ended at \$747.1 million at 31 March 2019: \$227.0 million higher than anticipated in the 2019 Plan & Estimates documents, as Government continues to build on the favourable performance experienced in 2018 and previous years. A significant portion of this cash will be used for the bond repayment in November 2019.

Similar to previous years, the first quarter's performance has positioned the Government to be optimistic about achieving its 2019 budgeted performance. Over the remaining three quarters of 2019 costs will have to be diligently monitored to ensure spending is not incurred, unnecessarily. Revenues derived from sources other than the Financial Services industry will play a key part in the overall achievement of the targeted surplus of \$60.9 million for the 2019 Financial Year.
