In exercise of the powers conferred by section 34 of the Public Health Act (2021 Revision), the Cabinet makes the following Regulations —

Citation

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Control of Covid-19 (Travel) (Amendment) Regulations, 2021.

Amendment of regulation 2 of the Control of Covid-19 (Travel) Regulations, 2021 - definitions

2. The *Control of Covid-19 (Travel) Regulations, 2021*, in these Regulations referred to as the “principal Regulations”, are amended in regulation 2 by inserting after the definition of the words “**fully vaccinated**” the following definition —

“**listed country**” means Belgium, Botswana, Eswatini, Lesotho, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, South Africa, Zambia and Zimbabwe and any other country which the Cabinet declares from time to time, by notice published in the *Gazette*, as a country —

- (a) where there is known or thought to be sustained human-to-human transmission of the SARS-CoV-2 Variant of Concern called Omicron B.1.1.529; or

- (b) from which there is a high risk of importation, infection or contamination of the variant of the virus referred to as SARS-CoV-2 Variant of Concern called Omicron B.1.1.529, via travel from that country to the Islands;”.

Insertion of regulation 7A - requirements for persons after visit to a listed country or contact with person from a listed country

3. The principal Regulations are amended by inserting after regulation 7 the following regulation —

“Requirements for persons after visit to a listed country or contact with person from listed country

7A. (1) Notwithstanding regulations 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7, the following persons shall be subject to the requirements set out in this regulation —

- (a) a person who has travelled to, from or through a listed country, within a period of twenty-one days or less immediately preceding the person’s arrival in the Islands; or
 - (b) a person who has come into contact with a person who has travelled to, from or through a listed country, within a period of twenty-one days or less immediately preceding the person’s arrival in the Islands.
- (2) Where a person referred to in paragraph (1) who, at the date of commencement of the *Control of Covid-19 (Travel) (Amendment) Regulations, 2021*, arrives in the Islands, the person shall —
- (a) upon arrival in the Islands, provide a customs and border control officer with —
 - (i) a copy of the person’s travel authorization or travel declaration, as applicable;
 - (ii) a copy of the person’s vaccination certificate, where required under these Regulations; and
 - (iii) a medical certificate which —
 - (A) shows that the person had a negative polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test of a sample from the upper airways no more than seventy-two hours prior to the departure of the person’s flight to the Islands; and
 - (B) specifies the name and address of the approved laboratory where the test was performed;
 - (b) be required by a customs and border control officer —
 - (i) to complete a medical and travel questionnaire in such form as is provided by the Medical Officer of Health; and



- (ii) to undergo a medical examination if the customs and border control officer considers that it is necessary;
 - (c) within twenty-four hours of arrival in the Islands, provide a sample from the upper airways to be tested by a polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test for the virus;
 - (d) from the date of arrival, remain in isolation for a period of not less than fourteen days at a private residence or such other place or facility of quarantine or isolation as specified by the Medical Officer of Health; and
 - (e) be subject to such directions as are provided by the Medical Officer of Health until the Medical Officer of Health determines that the person is not a health risk to the public.
- (3) A person referred to in paragraph (1) or a person who has come into contact with a person referred to in paragraph (1) within the past fourteen days who, at the date of commencement of the *Control of Covid-19 (Travel) (Amendment) Regulations, 2021*, is in the Islands shall be subject to such directions as are provided by the Medical Officer of Health until the Medical Officer of Health determines that the person is not a health risk to the public.
- (4) Where —
 - (a) upon arrival in the Islands, a person under paragraph (1) is allowed to isolate at a private residence; and
 - (b) there are other occupants who reside at the private residence who intend to stay at the residence during the period of isolation with the person,

the other occupants shall, for such period as may be determined by the Medical Officer of Health, which period shall be no less than fourteen days, be subject to such directions as are provided by the Medical Officer of Health, including directions of the Medical Officer of Health with regard to any testing prior to leaving the place or facility of quarantine or isolation.
- (5) Where a person under paragraph (1) arrives in the Islands and the person tests positive for the virus or shows respiratory symptoms or symptoms of the virus, the person shall be managed at a place and in such manner as specified by the Medical Officer of Health until the Medical Officer of Health determines that the person is no longer a health risk to the public.
- (6) A person who contravenes this regulation commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of ten thousand dollars or to imprisonment for a term of two years, or to both.

- (7) For the purposes of this regulation, a person referred to in paragraph (1) includes a crew member of a ship or aircraft referred to in regulation 8.”.

Repeal and substitution of Schedule 2 - ticket under the Control of Covid-19 (Travel) Regulations, 2021

- 4. The principal Regulations are amended by repealing Schedule 2 and substituting the following Schedule —
